The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-One.

AN ACT TO REQUIRE AN IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM FOR PURCHASERS OF KEGS OF BEER, ALE OR MALT LIQUOR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission shall provide an
2 identification system and guidelines for retailers, distributors or
3 "on premise" establishments to follow when supplying kegs of
4 beer, ale or malt liquor to private individuals for dispensing
5 alcoholic beverages. Such an identification system, in accordance
6 with M.G.L. 138, Sec. 78, shall include the name and address
7 where the keg will be used; quantity sold; a card identifying name
8 of the seller affixed to the keg; and a guideline that logs will be
9 considered confidential, except for inspection by the local police
10 department or licensing board, or by the Alcoholic Beverages
11 Control Commission.

12 The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission shall provide an
13 identification system and guidelines for retailers, distributors or
14 "on premise" establishments to follow when supplying kegs of
15 beer, ale or malt liquor to private individuals for dispensing
16 alcoholic beverages. Such an identification system, in accordance
17 with M.G.L. 138, Sec. 78, shall include the name and address of
18 the purchaser entered in a log book, together with date of sale
19 and quantity sold; a card identifying name of the seller affixed
20 to the keg; and a guideline that logs will be considered
21 confidential, except for inspection by the local police department
22 or licensing board, or by the Alcoholic Beverages Control
23 Commission.
