PROPOSAL FOR A LEGISLATIVE AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION TO LIMIT THE TERMS OF MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL COURT.

1 A majority of all the members elected to the Senate and House
2 of Representatives, in joint session, hereby declares it to be
3 expedient to alter the Constitution by the adoption of the
4 following Article of Amendment, to the end that it may become
5 a part of the Constitution [if similarly agreed to in a joint session
6 of the next General Court and approved by the people at the state
7 election next following]:

8 **ARTICLE OF AMENDMENT.**

9 SECTION 1. The second paragraph of section 1 of Article CI
10 of the Amendments to the Constitution is hereby amended by
11 adding the following sentence: — No person shall be eligible for
12 election to the house of representatives who has served six terms
13 in said office.

1 SECTION 2. Section 2 of said Article CI is hereby amended
2 by adding the following sentence: — No person shall be eligible
3 for election to the office of senator who has served six terms in
4 said office.
