**AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE APPOINTMENT OF SPECIAL POLICE OFFICERS IN THE TOWN OF DUXBURY.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The Town Manager of the Town of Duxbury  
2 may appoint such Special Police Officers for said Town of  
3 Duxbury as he deems necessary for the safety and protection of  
4 the citizens of said Town.

1 SECTION 2. Said Special Police Officers shall have the same  
2 power to make arrests and to perform other police functions as  
3 do Intermittent Police Officers of the Town and shall be subject  
4 to the same training requirements as said Intermittent Officers.

1 SECTION 3. Said Special Police Officers shall be appointed  
2 for an indefinite term subject to removal by the Town Manager.  
3 Said Special Police Officers shall be sworn before the Town Clerk  
4 of the Town of Duxbury who shall keep a record of all such  
5 appointments.

1 SECTION 4. Special Police Officers appointed under the pro-  
2 visions of this Act shall not be subject to the provisions of Chapter  
3 Thirty-one of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.
