AN ACT RELATIVE TO SPECIAL OFFICERS IN COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter one hundred forty-seven, section ten G is hereby
- 2 repealed and is replaced by the following section: —
- 3 The commissioner of Public Safety may, upon such reasonable
- 4 terms and conditions as may be prescribed by him, at the request
- 5 of an officer of a college or university, appoint employees of such
- 6 college or university as special police officers. Such special officers
- 7 shall serve for three years subject to removal by the commissioner.
- 8 Such special officers shall, while on official duty, have the
- 9 powers of an arrest for any rule or regulation by such college or
- 10 university. Nothing in this section shall give or authorize such
- 11 special officer the right to enforce any statute or local ordinance
- 12 on any public ways or whatever.
