6 3213, 3216, 3731, 3732, 3736, 3738, 3954, 3958, 4332, 4333, 4504,
7 4580, 4919, 5341 and 5433, relative to regulating the manufacture,
8 distribution and sale of alcoholic liquors.

9 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results
10 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
11 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
12 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk
13 of the House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday
14 in December, nineteen hundred and ninety-one.
