The committee on Government Regulations, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 743) of Emanuel G. Serra relative to the licensing of certain amusements and amusement devices, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2834) of John C. McNeil for legislation to authorize the operation of video poker games at certain non-profit organizations, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3960) of Peter A. Vellucci that part of the income from the State Lottery be used to establish programs for the rehabilitation of compulsive gamblers, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4134) of Angelo M. Scaccia for legislation to further regulate automatic amusement devices, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4502) of Paul Kollios for legislation to provide funding for a compulsive gamblers treatment program, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5880) ought to be adopted.

1 *Ordered*, That the committee on Government Regulations be
2 authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court to make
3 an investigation and study of House documents numbered 734,
4 2834, 3960, 4134 and 4502, matters relative to the regulation of
5 gaming.

6 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results
7 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
8 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
9 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk
10 of the House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday
11 in December, nineteen hundred and ninety-one.
