Fitzgerald for legislation to establish the citizens housing fund, the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 480) of Bill Owens, Shirley Owens-Hicks, Byron Rushing, Gloria L. Fox, Raymond A. Jordan, Jr., Alvin E. Thompson and Nelson Merced for legislation to establish a pre-homeownership club program in various cities throughout the Commonwealth, the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 481) of Bill Owens, Shirley Owens-Hicks, Byron Rushing, Gloria L. Fox, Raymond A. Jordan, Jr., Alvin E. Thompson and Nelson Merced for legislation to establish a savings program for low and moderate income first-time home buyers, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1758) of Shirley Owens-Hicks, Nelson Merced, Alvin E. Thompson, Raymond A. Jordan, Jr., Gloria L. Fox and Bill Owens for legislation to allow non-profit social agencies and community groups to acquire abandoned buildings in order to provide homes for the homeless and persons of low and moderate income, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1759) of Shirley Owens-Hicks, Susan D. Schur, Barbara Hildt, Nelson Merced, Gloria L. Fox and Bill Owens that the Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency be directed to establish programs to provide for homes for the homeless and persons of low and moderate income, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4349) of Barbara E. Gray that the Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency be authorized to establish a revolving loan fund to assist single parent heads of households, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5886) ought to be adopted.
