The committee on Public Services, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by resolve, Senate, No. 1014) of Edward P. Kirby that provision be made for an investigation and study by a special commission (including members of the General Court) relative to the pension system of the Commonwealth, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 443) of Alvin E. Thompson and another for legislation to place certified operators of waste water treatment facilities in Group 4 of the contributory retirement system, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1996) of Steven Angelo for legislation to regulate the hiring of professional management and instructional services in cities and towns, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2175) of Kevin P. Blanchette and Henri S. Rauschenbach relative to cost-of-living adjustments for certain retired employees in the Commonwealth and their beneficiaries, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4046) of the Massachusetts Association of Contributory Retirement Systems and J. James Marzilli, Jr., for legislation to provide for certain exemptions for contracts of professionals employed by retirement boards, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4052) of the Massachusetts Association of Contributory Retirement Systems and Richard T. Moore for legislation to clarify contracts of public employee retirement boards, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5332) of Thomas M. Finneran (with the approval of the mayor and city council) that the State-Boston retirement board be directed to retire Russell F. Fisher, a police officer of the city of Boston, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5390) of Frank M. Hynes (by vote of the town) relative to the retirement of Walter M. Stewart of the town of Scituate, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 6058) ought to be adopted.

1 *Ordered*, That the committee on Public Service be authorized
2 to sit during the recess of the General Court to make an
3 investigation and study of Senate document numbered 1014 and
4 House documents numbered 443, 1996, 2175, 4046, 4052, 5332 and
5 5390, relative to the provisions of public employee retirement
6 benefits and the law, rules and regulations thereof and relative
7 to the administration of the 106 retirement boards throughout the
8 Commonwealth.

9 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results
10 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
11 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
12 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk
13 of the House of Representatives by the last Wednesday in
14 December, nineteen hundred and ninety-one.
