AN ACT REGULATING THE USE OF ANABOLIC STEROIDS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 94C of the General Laws, as appearing in the 1990
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended in Section 1 by adding the
3 following definition: —

4 “Anabolic Steroid”, any drug or hormonal substance,
5 chemically and pharmacologically related to testosterone (Other
6 than estrogens, progestins and corticosteroids) that promotes
7 muscle growth, and includes: —

- 10 3. Clostebol
- 11 4. Dehydrochlormethyltestosterone
- 12 5. Dihydrotestosterone
- 13 6. Drostanolone
- 14 7. Ethylestrenol
- 15 8. Fluoxymesterone
- 16 9. Formebolone
- 17 10. Mesterolone
- 18 11. Methandienone
- 19 12. Methandranone
- 20 13. Methandriol
- 21 14. Methandrostenolone
- 22 15. Methenolone
- 23 16. Methyltestosterone
- 24 17. Mibolerone

- 25 18. Nandrolone
26 19. Norethandrolone
27 20. Oxandrolone
28 21. Oxymesterone
29 22. Oxymetholone
30 23. Stanolone
31 24. Stanozolol
32 25. Testolactone
33 26. Testosterone
34 27. Trenbolone, and
35 28. any salt, ester, of isomer or a drug or substance described
36 or listed in this paragraph, if the salt, ester, or isomer promotes
37 muscle growth.
- 38 Section 11. Chapter 94C of the General Laws as appearing in
39 the 1988 Official Edition, is hereby amended in Section 31,
40 pertaining to Class C substances, by adding the following
41 section: —
- 42 F. Any substance which contains any quantity of anabolic
43 steroids.
