In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Three.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO CIVIL SERVICE TESTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Strike Chapter 31 section 11A and replace with
2 a new 11A.

1 SECTION 2. Section 11A. Any employee who has served
2 provisionally in a civil service position for more than one year
3 and has received a rating of meets or greater on their most recent
4 EPRS, so called, pursuant to section 6A, shall be eligible to take
5 any promotional examination administered under the provisions
6 of sections 9, 10 or 11, if no such examination has been given
7 within the preceding year.

1 SECTION 3. The Administration shall create two lists of
2 applicants who pass any promotional or open and competitive
3 civil service examination. One list shall include all applicants who
4 are employed by an appointing authority in a title covered by such
5 examination at the time the list is certified, the second list shall
6 include all applicants not so employed. All civil service
7 appointments shall be made first from the list of applicants
8 employed in the title covered by the examination by an appointing
9 authority, and appointments from the list of applicants not so
10 employed shall be made only after the list of employed applicants
11 has been exhausted; and all such appointments shall be made in
12 conformity with the other provisions of this chapter.
