SENATE No. 1505

By Mr. Buell, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1505) of Robert C. Buell, Joseph N. Hermann, Ira Singer and George Nash (by vote of the town) for legislation to authorize the town of Middleton to continue the employment of George Nash as fire chief. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Three.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF MIDDLETON TO CONTINUE THE EMPLOYMENT OF GEORGE NASH AS FIRE CHIEF.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law
2 to the contrary, George Nash, as chief of the fire department in
3 the town of Middleton, is hereby authorized to continue in such
4 position until and including March twenty-ninth, nineteen
5 hundred and ninety-six; provided however, that he is mentally and
6 physically capable of performing the duties of his position; and,
7 provided further, that he shall annually, at his own expense, be
8 examined by an impartial physician designated by the town of
9 Middleton to determine such capability. No further deductions
10 shall be made from the regular compensation of said employee
11 under the provisions of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws
12 for service subsequent to March twenty-ninth, nineteen hundred
13 and ninety-three and, upon retirement, said George Nash shall
14 receive a superannuation allowance equal to that to which he
15 would have been entitled had he retired on said date.
