Wagner for legislation to provide that persons found guilty of welfare fraud shall be ineligible for further assistance until a fine has been paid or a sentence has been served; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 698) of Frederick E. Berry, Kevin M. Burke, District Attorney for the Eastern District, and James P. Jajuga for legislation to authorize Superior Court clerks and assistant clerks to issue warrants, search warrants and summonses; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 736) of James P. Jajuga, Frank G. Cousins, Jr., Charles E. Shannon and Paul E. Caron for legislation to authorize wiretapping in certain circumstances; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 746) of William R. Keating and Thomas P. Walsh for legislation relative to attendance at juvenile court proceedings; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 748) of William R. Keating for legislation to extend certain lien rights to physicians; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 784) of Robert S. Hurd for legislation to exempt assets received by inheritance of gift prior to or during a marriage from inclusion as part of the estate in divorce settlements; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 828) of W. Paul White and Mary C. Fitzpatrick for legislation relative to dispensing with required consent in certain adoption cases where the child is in the care and custody of the Department of Social Services or any licensed child care agency; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 869) of Charles E. Shannon for legislation to require the satisfaction of all debts of construction before the issuance of an occupancy permit by a city or town; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1613) of Walter A. DeFilippi and Shannon P. O'Brien for legislation relative to the family support and access enforcement act; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1614) of Shannon P. O'Brien for legislation relative to alimony and assign-

ment of property; and the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1615) of Shannon P. O'Brien for legislation to provide equity in parental relationships for children of divorced parents, reports the accompanying order (Senate, No. 1715).
