RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE LICENSURE OF ADDITIONAL HEALTH OCCUPATIONS.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to consist of
2 three members of the Senate, five members of the House of Repre-
3 sentatives, and seven persons to be appointed by the Governor of
4 whom one should be an administrator of an acute care hospital,
5 one should be a practicing physician, one should be an administra-
6 tor of a long term care facility, and the remaining four shall be
7 representatives of the public, is hereby established for the purpose
8 of making a study and investigation relative to the feasibility and
9 necessity of licensing additional health manpower. Said commis-
10 sion shall in the course of its investigation and study consult with
11 state and federal agencies, associations, and experts in the field of
12 health manpower and the licensing thereof.

13 Said commission shall report to the General Court the results of
14 its investigation and study and its recommendations, if any,
15 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its recommenda-
16 tions into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the House of
17 Representatives on or before January 1, 1986. No additional
18 health occupations shall be licensed until the commission has
19 reported its findings to the Legislature.
