AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE WITHOUT PAYMENT OF A FEE OF DISTINCTIVE LICENSE PLATES FOR SO-CALLED "PICK UP TRUCKS" TO FORMER PRISONERS OF WAR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sixth paragraph of section 2 of chapter 90 of
2 the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 2 of
3 chapter 597 of the Acts of 1982, is hereby further amended by
4 inserting after the fourth sentence the following sentence: — As
5 used in the preceding sentence, "pleasure passenger vehicle" shall
6 include so-called "pick up trucks" used for non-commercial
7 purposes.

1 SECTION 2. Section 33 of said chapter 90, as most recently
2 amended by section 3 of chapter 597 of the acts of 1982 is hereby
3 further amended by inserting at the end of the twenty-third para-
4 graph the following sentence: — As used in this paragraph "plea-
5 sure passenger vehicle" shall include so-called "pick up trucks"
6 used for non-commercial purposes.
