AN ACT RELATIVE TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section three of chapter two hundred and nine A of the General
- 2 Laws is hereby amended by adding at the end of the second
- 3 paragraph the following: —
- 4 No fee shall be charged for said service of process.
