AN ACT AUTHORIZING LOCAL CABLE TELEVISION STATIONS TO RECEIVE NOTICES OF ALL LICENSE APPLICATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 15A of Chapter 138 as most recently
2 amended by Chapter 318 of the Acts of 1980 is hereby further
3 amended by adding the following new paragraph: —

4 All notices submitted to newspapers for publication in such city
5 or town including any county as presently prescribed by Chapter
6 138 shall also be sent to local cable television stations operating in
7 affected areas of such cities and town.

1 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.

By the Committee on Education, in response to a resolution of the House of Representatives, passed July 1, 1954, relating to the establishment of a National Board of Education, the following report is submitted:

As the House of Representatives has passed the following resolution:

SECTION 1. Section 104 of the Act (Public Law 85-52) is amended to read as follows: "The Secretary of the Department of the Interior shall conduct a study of the feasibility of establishing a National Board of Education, and to report thereon to the House of Representatives at the end of the session next."

SECTION 2. The Act shall take effect as if enacted on the date of the passage of this Act.
