## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Four.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE DELIVERY OF ELDER AND HUMAN SERVICES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 16 of chapter 6A, as most recently  
2 amended by section 4 of chapter 552 of the acts of 1978, is hereby  
3 further amended by inserting in the second paragraph after the  
4 words "within the executive office of human services" the follow-  
5 ing: — , provided that the town of Dover shall be included in the  
6 area and region which includes the town of Needham.

1 SECTION 2. Subsection (c) of section 4 of chapter 19A, as  
2 most recently amended by section 63 of chapter 393 of the acts of  
3 1979, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof the  
4 following: — , and, provided further that the towns of Dover and  
5 Needham shall be served by the same home care provider;.

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

AN ACT TO AMEND THE ACT APPROVED MARCH 3, 1870, RELATIVE TO THE GOVERNMENT OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.

Enacted by the House of Representatives, January 1, 1907.

Approved August 1, 1907.

SECTION 1. That in all cases where the Board of Commissioners of the District of Columbia shall be unable to perform the duties of their office, the same shall be performed by the Board of Commissioners of the District of Columbia, or by such other persons as may be designated by the Board of Commissioners of the District of Columbia.

SEC. 2. That the Board of Commissioners of the District of Columbia shall have the same powers and authority as the Board of Commissioners of the District of Columbia, and shall be subject to the same provisions of law as the Board of Commissioners of the District of Columbia.
