AN ACT ADJUSTING THE ESTATE TAX.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subsection (a) of Section 3 of Chapter 65C of the
2 General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the word "Thirty"
3 and inserting in place thereof the word "Sixty", and by striking out
4 the word "Sixty" and inserting in place thereof the words "One
5 Hundred and Twenty"; effective January 1, 1985.

1 SECTION 2. Said subsection (a) as amended by Section 1 of
2 this act, is hereby amended by striking out the word "Sixty" and
3 inserting in place thereof the words "One Hundred" and by striking
4 out the words "One Hundred and Twenty" and inserting in place
5 thereof the words "One Hundred and Seventy-Five", effective
6 January 1, 1986.
