AN ACT CLARIFYING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE SUNDAY LAW,
SO-CALLED.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Clause (50) of section 6 of chapter 136 of the General Laws, as
2 amended by chapter 8 of the acts of 1983, is hereby further
3 amended by striking out the second sentence and inserting in place
4 thereof the following sentence: —

5 Any store or shop which qualifies for exemption under this
6 clause or under clause (25) or clause (27) and which employs more
7 than a total of seven persons, including the proprietor, on Sunday
8 or any day throughout the week, shall compensate all employees
9 engaged in the work performed on Sunday pursuant to the provi-
10 sions of this clause, or clause (25) or clause (27), excepting those
11 bona fide executive or administrative or professional persons earn-
12 ing more than two hundred dollars a week, at a rate not less than
13 one and one-half times the employee's regular rate, provided,
14 however, any facility, as provided for in section 3 of chapter 40A of
15 the General Laws, and the owner of which is qualified under the
16 provisions of chapter 61A of the General Laws, shall be exempt
17 from such requirements.
