In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Four.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE APPORTIONMENT OF REVENUES OF THE STATE LOTTERY COMMISSION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 10 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
2 out section 25 and inserting in place thereof the following: —

3 *Section 25.* The apportionment of the total revenues accruing
4 from the sale of lottery tickets or shares and from all other sources
5 shall be as follows: — (a) the payment of prizes to the holders of
6 winning tickets or shares which in any case shall be no less than
7 forty-five per cent of the total revenues accruing from the sale of
8 lottery tickets; (b) the payment of costs incurred in the operation
9 and administration of the lottery, including the expenses of the
10 commission and the costs resulting from any contract or contracts
11 entered into for promotional, advertising or operation services
12 provided that 10% of the total cost of contracts entered into for
13 that purpose shall be used to promote BEANO, or for the purchase
14 or lease of lottery equipment and materials which in no case shall
15 exceed fifteen per cent of total revenues accruing from the sale of
16 lottery tickets, subject to appropriation; and (c) the balance to be
17 used for the purpose set forth in clause (c) of section thirty-five.
