AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE FORM OF THE WARRANT TO DOG OFFICERS.

1 Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
2 out section 153, as most recently amended by section 3 of chapter
3 289 of the acts of 1976, and inserting in place thereof the following
4 section: —

5 *Section 153.* In the several cities and towns of the several coun-
6 ties such warrant may be in the following form: —

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby required to enforce all laws, rules and regulations or whatever pursuant to the provisions of chapter 140 and any general law that effects the well being of any dog that may reside within said city or town, or any dog that may enter said city or town.

Any dog that is not found diseased, injured or otherwise may be sold for not less than three dollars, any such sale you are to forthwith pay over said money to the city or town treasurer, before such dog sold said person shall be required to register and procure a license tag for said dog from city or town clerk where said dog is to be kept, in accordance with chapter one hundred and forty

section one hundred and thirty-seven of chapter one hundred and forty of the General Laws.
