1 The first sentence of section 5C of chapter 59 of the General

3 hereby amended by inserting after the word "taxpayer", on line 10,
4 the second time it appears, the words: — or to the principal
5 residence of the mother, father, daughter, or son of a taxpayer as
6 used by such mother, father, daughter, or son.
