AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO SETTLE A CERTAIN ACTION AGAINST THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. To provide for the cost of settling the action of

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 8, Clause 18
