AN ACT RELATIVE TO CERTAIN ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANTS IN THE SUPERIOR COURT DEPARTMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 83 of Chapter 276 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by chapter 779 of the acts of 1981, is hereby amended by
3 striking out the second paragraph and inserting in place thereof
4 the following paragraph: —

5 In the superior court department, for such counties as have
6 twenty or more probation officers, there shall be designated by the
7 chief probation officer, from among said probation officers, an
8 administrative assistant to said chief probation officer. Said admin-
9 istrative assistant shall, in addition to his regular duties, perform
10 such other duties as said chief probation officer may determine
11 and shall receive a salary at the maximum job group level as a first
12 assistant chief probation officer.

13 This act shall take effect as of January 1, 1984.
