**AN ACT PROVIDING PARKING PRIVILEGES FOR CERTAIN HANDICAPPED PERSONS.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 2 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as most recently  
2 amended by chapter 450 of the acts of 1980, is hereby further  
3 amended by inserting after the sixth paragraph the following  
4 paragraph: —

5 The registrar may also issue a numbered portable plate bearing  
6 the international symbol of access and an identification card bear-  
7 ing a photograph of the disabled person and any other pertinent  
8 information to be used by any person who has suffered a severe  
9 and permanent disability that impedes mobility or is a life-  
10 threatening disability (cardiovascular or pulmonary) to permit  
11 parking of any pleasure passenger vehicle in an HP, V and handi-  
12 capped parking space. The portable plate shall be placed in the  
13 lower left edge of the windshield on the driver's side of any pleasure  
14 passenger vehicle the disabled person may ride in and the card shall  
15 be carried on the person of the disabled person.

16 The registrar may determine such standards of disability and of  
17 qualifications for the issuance of said plate and identification card  
18 including a fee, as he deems proper.

# HOUSE

The House of Representatives is the lower chamber of the United States Congress. It is composed of members from each state and the District of Columbia. The members are elected by the voters of their respective states and districts.
