AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT TO THE CHIEF PROBATION OFFICER OF SUFFOLK COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 83 of chapter 276 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by section 71A of chapter 393 of the Acts of 1979, is
3 hereby further amended by adding after the second paragraph,
4 inserted by section 71A of said chapter 393, the following
5 paragraph: —

6 In the Superior Court Department for such counties as have
7 twenty or more probation officers, there shall be designated by the
8 Chief Probation Officer from among said probation officers, an
9 administrative assistant to said Chief Probation Officer. Said
10 administrative assistant, shall in addition to his regular duties, per-
11 form such other duties as said Chief Probation Officer may deter-
12 mine and shall receive a salary equal to step 7 of level 18 of the
13 personnel classification and compensation plan of the Massachu-
14 setts Trial Court.
