AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE BOARD OF ASSESSORS IN THE TOWN OF
RANDOLPH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or
2 special law to the contrary, the employees of the board of assessors
3 in the town of Randolph shall not be subject to the provisions of
4 chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. The provisions of section one of this act shall not
2 impair the civil service status of any of the incumbent employees of
3 said board of assessors in the positions said employees hold on the
4 effective date of this act.
