

HOUSE No. 2461

By Mr. McNeil of Malden, petition of the National Association of Government Employees and John C. McNeil that certain clerical employees of the Commonwealth having daily contact with prisoners, parolees or mentally defective persons be placed in Group 2 of the contributory retirement system. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Five.

AN ACT TO INCLUDE CERTAIN CLERICAL EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH IN GROUP 2 OF THE STATE RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 3 of Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended
- 2 by inserting in the definition of *Group 2* therein, after the words
- 3 "wayward children" the following new words:
- 4 "or clerical employees of the commonwealth whose regular
- 5 and/major duties require them to have daily contact with prison-
- 6 ers under the department of correction or parolees or persons who
- 7 are mentally ill or persons who are mentally defective or defective
- 8 delinquents or wayward children".

It is the duty of the House to inquire into the conduct of the President and to report thereon to the Senate. It is also the duty of the House to impeach the President if he is found guilty of high crimes and misdemeanors.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article II, Section 2, Clause 1

The President shall have the right to grant reprieves and pardons for offenses against the United States, except in cases of impeachment.

He shall have the right to make appointments, and shall have the right to receive Ambassadors and other public Ministers.

He shall have the right to make treaties, provided two thirds of the Senators present concur.

He shall have the right to nominate and to receive, and shall have the right to commission all the Officers of the United States.

He shall have the right to grant Reprieves and Pardons for offenses against the United States, except in cases of impeachment.
