The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Five.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING AN EARLY RETIREMENT INCENTIVE FOR CAREER EMPLOYEES WITH LONG YEARS OF SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter thirty-
2 two of the General Laws or any general or special law to the
3 contrary, any employee in the Commonwealth who is currently
4 classified in either Group 1 or Group 2 of the contributory
5 retirement system, as such groups are defined in section one of
6 chapter thirty-two, and who is a member of said retirement system
7 as defined in section one of chapter thirty-two and has been a
8 member for not less than thirty years in the aggregate, shall be
9 eligible, regardless of age, to apply for and receive a super-
10 annuation retirement allowance as authorized by section five of
11 chapter thirty-two, using the 2.5 factor under subparagraph (a) of
12 paragraph (2) of section five.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage and
2 shall expire on the thirty-first of December, nineteen hundred and
3 eighty-six.
