AN ACT TO EXTEND THE SALES TAX EXEMPTION TO HOSPITAL-VENDORS
LICENSED BY THE MASSACHUSETTS COMMISSION FOR THE BLIND.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Subsection 18 of Section One of Chapter 64H, as most recently
2 amended by Chapter 514 of the Acts and Resolves of 1978, is
3 hereby further amended by striking the period at the end thereof
4 and inserting in its place the following new sentence: - “, except-
5 ing hospital vendors licensed by the Massachusetts Commission
6 for the Blind.”
