AN ACT PROVIDING FOR NONDISCLOSURE OF PROTECTED INFORMATION IN LITIGATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Clause the twenty-sixth of section 7 of chapter 4 of the General
2 Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 230 of the acts of 1979,
3 is hereby further amended by inserting, after subclause (i), the
4 following subclause: — (i) documents including but not limited to
5 writings, drawings, graphs, charts, photographs, phone-records,
6 and other data compilations from which information can be
7 obtained which are prepared or compiled in anticipation of
8 litigation or which are related to the subject matter of pending
9 litigation, and which are not subject to discovery under the
10 Massachusetts rules of court.
