

HOUSE No. 2628

By Mr. DiMasi of Boston, petition of Salvatore F. DiMasi for legislation to provide that military service performed by certain employees be counted as creditable service for purposes of retirement. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Five.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT MILITARY SERVICE PERFORMED BY CERTAIN EMPLOYEES BE COUNTED AS CREDITABLE SERVICE FOR PURPOSES OF RETIREMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The third subparagraph of paragraph (h) of subdivision (1) of
2 section 4 of chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
3 adding the following sentence: — Any member who is a veteran as
4 defined in section one having not less than twenty years accumul-
5 ative service in the commonwealth or any of its political subdivi-
6 sions shall be granted creditable service up to four years for mil-
7 itary service performed, provided that he pays into the annuity
8 savings fund of the state retirement system such amounts as he
9 would have contributed during the periods of such service at the
10 level of his entry position.
