**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Five.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO RETIREMENT OF JUDICIAL OFFICERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 32 is hereby amended by adding at the end of Section  
2 65A the following: —

3 In determining whether a judge who was appointed prior to  
4 January 2, 1975 or first appointed on or after January 2, 1975, has  
5 served in any such office or offices at least fifteen (15) years  
6 continuously, notwithstanding that this continuous service may  
7 involve one or more appointments made subsequent to January 2,  
8 1975 and would be, for the purposes of the second or third para-  
9 graphs of Section 65C, entitled to a pension for life under Sections  
10 65A or 65B, the period, not exceeding one year, of his wartime  
11 service as defined in section 1 of chapter 31, whether before or after  
12 his appointment as a judge, shall be added to and deemed continu-  
13 ous with the period of his service in any such office or offices.

14 In determining whether a judge who was appointed prior to  
15 January 2, 1975 or first appointed on or after January 2, 1975, has  
16 served in any such office or offices at least fifteen (15) years  
17 continuously, notwithstanding that this continuous service may  
18 involve one or more appointments made subsequent to January 2,  
19 1975, and would be, for the purpose of the second or third para-  
20 graphs of Section 65C, entitled to a pension for life under Sections  
21 65A or 65B, each three years spent by him in the service of the  
22 commonwealth or of any county, city or town thereof shall count  
23 as one year of creditable service and each such year so credited, but  
24 in no event to exceed more than four years of such creditable  
25 service, shall be added to and deemed continuous with the period  
26 of his service in any such office or offices.
