AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE TIME FOR FILING ACCIDENTAL DISABILITY CLAIMS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first sentence of subdivision (1) of section 7 of chapter 32 of
2 the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 9 of
3 chapter 826 of the acts of 1967, is hereby further amended by
4 adding the following words: — provided, however, that the appli-
5 cation for accidental disability retirement is filed within one month
6 after the date of his retirement or if he did not know and could not
7 have known of such disability by such time, within six months of
8 the time he knew or should have known of it.
