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## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

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In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Five.

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### AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING A FORMULARY OF INTERCHANGEABLE DRUG PRODUCTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 12D of Chapter 112 of the General Laws as most recently  
2 amended by chapter 707 of the acts of 1977 is hereby amended by  
3 inserting as the 6th paragraph thereof the following: —  
4 “Notwithstanding the foregoing, in cases where interchange  
5 would be permitted as indicated by the signature of the practitioner  
6 of the first signature line, and where the patient requests the exact  
7 drug product prescribed and when the patient or his/her designee  
8 shall verify the request by affixing his/her signature on the back of  
9 the prescription form, then the pharmacists shall dispense the exact  
10 drug product as written by the practitioner.”
