By Mr. Constantino of Clinton, petition of William Constantino, Jr., for legislation to direct the Department of Public Works to install pavement markings on all numbered routes within the Commonwealth which are not state highways. Transportation.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Five.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN PAVEMENT MARKINGS ON CERTAIN NUMBERED ROUTES WITHIN THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The department of public works shall provide for
2 the construction and maintenance of pavement markings on all
3 numbered routes within the commonwealth which are not state
4 highways, and also on all state highways. Such work shall be done
5 by the department or by contract with outside companies annually.

1 SECTION 2. Funds to pay for the construction and mainte-
2 nance provided for in section one of this act shall be made available
3 by a general appropriation.

The Committee on Education and Labor, created by the House on May 12, 1891, has the honor to submit herewith its report on the bill (H. R. 10300) to amend the act of March 2, 1891, relating to the Department of Education and Labor, and for other purposes.

IN RESPONSE TO A RESOLUTION PASSED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

SECTION 1. The Department of Education and Labor is authorized to employ such personnel as may be necessary for the efficient conduct of its business, and such personnel shall be appointed by the Secretary of the Department.

SECTION 2. There is set apart for the Department of Education and Labor such amount of the proceeds of the sale of the United States Government lands as is hereinafter provided.
