By Mr. Speliotis of Danvers, petition of Theodore C. Speliotis that certain service by elected officials be considered as creditable service for purposes of retirement. Public Service.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO CREDITABLE SERVICE TOWARDS RETIREMENT SYSTEMS AND PENSIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 4 of Chapter 32 of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by Chapter 630 of the Acts of 1982, is hereby amended in
3 subdivision (1) by inserting at the end of the first sentence of said
4 subdivision (1) the following: — ;provided, however, that for any
5 elected official receiving less than \$10,000 per annum for service in
6 such elected position, creditable service for any years of service
7 pursuant to an election subsequent to the effective date of this act
8 shall be computed at a rate not to exceed two-thirds years of
9 creditable service for each calendar year during which such service
10 is rendered.
