AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A COST OF LIVING PAY ADJUSTMENT FOR PREVIOUSLY RETIRED JUDGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Upon the effective date of this act any justice or chief justice of
- 2 any court of the commonwealth, who retired prior to July one,
- 3 nineteen hundred and eighty-two, being paid a pension allowance
- 4 under chapter thirty-two, shall be entitled to receive a pension at an
- 5 annual rate increased by twenty-five percent of the pension allow-
- 6 ance he was receiving immediately prior to the effective date of this
- 7 act, shall be paid from the same source and in the same manner as
- 8 the salaries of like judicial officers of the court or courts are paid.
