AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIDDLESEX COUNTY TO BORROW MONEY TO MAKE CERTAIN IMPROVEMENTS AT THE MIDDLESEX COUNTY HOSPITAL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any special or
2 general law to the contrary, the County Commissioners of Mid-
3 dlesex County are hereby authorized to expend for the Middlesex
4 County Hospital a sum not to exceed six hundred and twenty-five
5 thousand dollars (\$625,000.00) to purchase and install various "life
6 safety" systems and to update an antiquated heating system in
7 projects entitled, Fire Protection/ Life Safety, Plumbing and Heat-
8 ing, Electrical and Architectural Barrier Projects, including archi-
9 tectural and engineering fees and all other costs incidental thereto
10 and connected therewith.

1 SECTION 2. For the purposes authorized by Section 1, the
2 Treasurer of said County with the approval of a majority of the
3 County Commissioners, may borrow upon the credit of the County
4 such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding in the aggregate six
5 hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars and may issue bonds or
6 notes of the county therefor, which shall bear on their face the
7 words, Middlesex County Hospital Loan, Acts of 1985. Each au-
8 thorized issue shall constitute a separate loan and such loans shall
9 be payable not more than fifteen years from their dates. The bonds

10 or notes shall be signed by the County Treasurer and countersigned
11 by a majority of the County Commissioners. The County may sell
12 said securities at public or private sale, upon such terms and condi-
13 tions as the County Commissioners may deem proper, but not for
14 less than their par value. Indebtedness incurred hereunder shall
15 except as herein provided, be subject to Chapter Thirty Five of the
16 General Laws.
