1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of two
2 members of the senate, three members of the house of representa-
3 tives, the registrar of motor vehicles or his designee, a member of
4 the executive board of the Massachusetts police association, a
5 member of the Massachusetts state police association, a member of
6 the metropolitan district commission police association, and three
7 persons to be appointed by the governor, is hereby established for
8 the purpose of making an investigation and study of any and all
9 safety measures for public safety personnel in the official discharge
10 of their duties.
