AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE USE OF COLORED LIGHTS ON CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 2 amended by section 2 of chapter 653 of the Acts of 1983 is hereby
- 3 further amended by inserting after the word "town" in the fourth
- 4 line of the second paragraph the following: — "call firemen".
