By Mr. Fitzgerald of Boston, petition of Kevin W. Fitzgerald that local councils for children be appointed as members to the Statewide Advisory Council to the Office for Children, Human Services and Elderly Affairs.

AN ACT TO ALLOW EACH LOCAL COUNCIL FOR CHILDREN TO HAVE ONE VOTE ON THE STATEWIDE ADVISORY COUNCIL TO THE OFFICE FOR CHILDREN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 8 of Chapter 28A of the Massachusetts General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking the first paragraph and inserting in
3 place thereof the following: —

4 “There shall be a Statewide Advisory Council for Children to
5 consist of the Secretaries of the Executive offices of Human Serv-
6 ices, Manpower Affairs, Communities and Development, and the
7 Commissioner of Education, or their designees, twelve members
8 appointed by the Governor, and one member from each local
9 Council for Children established under Section 7.”
