AN ACT EXEMPTING ANY PUBLIC SAFETY VEHICLE FROM THE SPECIAL FUELS EXCISE TAX.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 64E of the General Laws is hereby amended by insert-
- 2 ing after section 5 the following section: —
- 3 *Section 5A.* No excise shall be due under this chapter on any
- 4 special fuels which are purchased by any city or town and used for
- 5 Public Safety purposes.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I, Section 9, Clause 2

IN ALL CRIMINAL CASES THE ACCUSED SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT TO
