RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT AGE AND ALLOWANCES FOR EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH, CITIES AND TOWNS AND MATTERS RELATING THERETO.

1     *Resolved*, That a special commission to consist of three  
2 members of the senate, five members of the house of representa-  
3 tives, the chairman of the retirement law commission or his designee  
4 and four persons to be appointed by the governor one of whom  
5 shall be a member of a labor organization, is hereby established for  
6 the purpose of making an investigation and study of the subject  
7 matter contained in House bill 590 of nineteen hundred and  
8 seventy-three relative to the retirement age and allowances for  
9 employees of the Commonwealth, cities and towns and matters  
10 relating thereto.
