AN ACT EXEMPTING CERTAIN TOWNS FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF PROVIDING POLICE OFFICERS AT POLLING PLACES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 72 of chapter 54 of the General Laws is hereby amended
- 2 by adding the following paragraph: —
- 3 Towns having a population of less than twenty-five thousand
- 4 inhabitants are exempt from the provisions of this section.
