RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN ATHLETIC FACILITY IN THE DIGHTON-TAUNTON AREA.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of two members
2 of the senate, three members of the house of representatives and
3 two persons appointed by the governor, is hereby established for
4 the purpose of making an investigation and study relative to the
5 conversion of the Taunton Greyhound Park Facility, which is
6 located on the border of the town of Dighton and the city of
7 Taunton, into a championship, inter-scholastic, high school level,
8 athletic facility which would be capable of being utilized for such
9 events as football, soccer and field hockey games, track meets and
10 other sporting events as well as band competition, concerts and
11 various other school related activities. Such commission may
12 receive and expend such funds as may be donated to it for its
13 purposes.
