AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALE OR DISTRIBUTION OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS TO PERSONS UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN YEARS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 270 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
- 2 out section 6, as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition and insert-
- 3 ing in place thereof the following section: —
- 4 Section 6. Whoever sells a cigarette, chewing tobacco, snuff or
- 5 any tobacco in any of its forms to any person under the age of
- 6 eighteen years or, not being his parent or guardian, gives a cigarette,
- 7 chewing tobacco, snuff or tobacco in any of its forms to any person
- 8 under the age of eighteen years shall be punished by a fine of not less
- 9 than one hundred dollars for the first offense. not less than two
- 10 hundred dollars for a second offense and not less than three
- 11 hundred dollars for any third or subsequent offense.
