### AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING CERTAIN NOTICE REQUIREMENTS FOR CITIES AND TOWNS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 10 of chapter 83 of the General Laws, as amended by  
2 section 3 of chapter 736 of the acts of 1964, is hereby further  
3 amended by striking out the second sentence and inserting in place  
4 thereof the following sentence: — Such rules and regulations shall  
5 be published once in a newspaper published in the city or town if  
6 there be any, and if not, then in a newspaper published in the  
7 county, and shall include a notice that said rules and regulations  
8 shall be available for inspection by the public, and shall not take  
9 effect until such publication has been made.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I. Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

But no Representative shall be chosen for a Term longer than two Years; and no Person shall be Representative who shall not, when elected, have seven Years since last attained to the Age of twenty five Years, and seven Years since he became a Citizen of the United States; and when elected shall have been seven Years a Citizen of that State in which he shall be chosen.

Representatives and electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature. No Person shall be Representative who shall not, when elected, have seven Years since last attained to the Age of twenty five Years, and seven Years since he became a Citizen of the United States; and when elected shall have been seven Years a Citizen of that State in which he shall be chosen.
