AN ACT AMENDING MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION LAWS REGARDING PRISONER OF WAR PLATES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The sixth paragraph of section 2 of chapter 90 of the General
2 Laws, as most recently amended by section 2 of chapter 597 of the
3 acts of 1982, is hereby further amended by striking out the fourth
4 sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: —
5 The registrar of motor vehicles may issue, without charge to former
6 prisoners of war, defined as any regularly appointed, enrolled,
7 enlisted, or inducted member of the military forces of the United
8 States who was captured and incarcerated by an enemy of the
9 United States during an armed conflict, upon presentation of satis-
10 factory evidence of such prisoner of war status, as determined by
11 the registrar, distinctive registration plates for one pleasure vehicle
12 owned and principally used, or leased for at least one year by said
13 individual.
