AN ACT RELATIVE TO EXAMINATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT
OR PROMOTION TO THE OFFICE OF DETECTIVE INSPECTOR
IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Examinations for appointment or promotion to
2 the office of detective inspector in the department of
3 public safety shall be open only to persons who have
4 completed five years of full-time service as a member
5 of the state police, as a member of the police or fire
6 force of a city or town, as a member of the Federal
7 Bureau of Investigation, or as a member of any other
8 governmental agency doing work similar to that
9 required of a detective inspector in the department
10 of public safety.
